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## **Mission Statement**

The mission of the Lincoln Town Archives is to collect, preserve, and provide access to the history and culture of the town of Lincoln, Massachusetts. Our collections are comprised of municipal records, manuscripts, books, photographs, audiovisual materials, and other ephemera documenting the history of Lincoln from its days as a Precinct of Concord in 1746 to the present. The collections are held at both the Lincoln Public Library and the Lincoln Town Offices.

## **Finding Aids**

The collections described in this booklet have corresponding finding aids. A finding aid provides a detailed overview of an individual collection, including a series- and/or item-level inventory of materials in that collection.

## Archival Collections

**2002.001 Lincoln Buildings Collection:** A large (approximately 800 items) artificial collection of photographs and documentation on mostly historical buildings in Lincoln. Includes photographs from mid-19<sup>th</sup> century to 1980s, historical commission forms (many completed by Lincoln Historical Commission or Lincoln Historical Society), floor plans, framing plans, clippings, and related materials. Most of the collection is from unidentified sources.

**2002.002 Drumlin Farm Collection:** Donated by Dr. Elizabeth A. Little in the 1990s, this collection documents land ownership and land use of the various parcels from the 17<sup>th</sup> through the 20<sup>th</sup> century comprising the present Drumlin Farm.

**2002.003 DeCordova and Dana Museum Collection:** An artificial collection from multiple donors, in part unknown, that documents the early years of the DeCordova and Dana Museum and Park Advisory Board, along with photographs of the museum collections as they appeared in the 1930s.

**2002.004 Lincoln Center Photograph Collection:** A small collection of glass plate negatives, mostly of the Lincoln Center area, taken between 1880 and 1900, and provide views of the town center before and after construction of the stone church and the Bemis town hall.

**2002.005 Isabelle Peirce Collection:** A large collection (approximately 1400 items) comprising largely of letters to Isabelle (Isabel, Isabella) Carret Peirce before and after her marriage to William L.G. Peirce, letters from William L.G. Peirce to Isabelle including pre-marriage 'love letters' and letters written home during the Civil War, other family letters, deeds, tax bills, and other materials relating to the Peirce family.

**2002.006 Nelson Family Papers:** The collection comprises deeds, plans of land, and other legal documents of the 19<sup>th</sup> century relating to property acquired by Josiah Nelson and later his son Joseph Nelson. The collection also includes financial records of Joseph Nelson, noted 19<sup>th</sup> century Lincoln housewright, and miscellaneous items. Most deeds and other items are fragile and are encapsulated in Mylar.

**2002.007 Codman Community Farm Collection:** Organizational and financial records of the Codman Community Farms, Inc., from the 1970s and 1980s. The collection also includes clippings and newsletters from the 1970s.

**2002.008 Lincoln 4-H Clubs Collection:** Primarily newsletters and clippings relating to the activities of the several 4-H clubs in Lincoln, from the 1960s and 1970s. The collection also includes prizes and awards won by local clubs.

**2003.001 Lincoln Gravestone Photographs:** Donated in June 2002 by Fred Tingley, the collection comprises 35 mm negatives of pre-1900 gravestones in Lincoln cemeteries, taken by Tingley for the Cemetery Commission.

**2003.002 Henry Kane Photograph Collection:** Photographs are taken by Lincoln photographer Henry Kane for the 1976 bicentennial. Some photographs appeared in the 1954 Lincoln calendar.

**2003.003 Ed Williams Photograph Collection:** Photographs taken by Lincoln photographer Ed L. Williams of scenic views in Lincoln in February 1965.

**2003.004 Inheritance Photograph Collection:** Photographs taken by Lincoln photographer Ruth Williams for book *Inheritance* by Margaret Mutchler (Peg) Martin, 1987, Lincoln Historical Society.

**2003.005 Ruth Williams Photograph Collection:** Photographs taken by Lincoln photographer Ruth Williams, ca. 1970s, of Lincoln dwellings showing interior and exterior detail.

**2004.006 Ted Polumbaum Collection:** Negatives of photographs of Lincoln Fourth of July parade, 1976; Lincoln Nursery School; peace marches, etc. Taken by photographer Ted Polumbaum, 1957-1976.

**2003.007 Keeping Tradition Alive Transcript:** Transcripts of interviews with long-time Lincoln residents relating to agriculture in Lincoln.

**2003.008 Lincoln Post Office Collection:** Correspondence and maps relating to rural mail routes in Lincoln during early 20<sup>th</sup> century, other post office records from 1890s.

**2003.009 Farrar Family Collection:** Genealogical and biographical material relating to the Farrar family, correspondence of Farrar family, other historical materials relating to the Farrar family in Lincoln, including records relating to the murder of Constable James Farrar in 1894 by William Barrett.

**2003.010 French Family Collection:** Letters of Rev. Jonathan French and his wife Rebecca Farrar French, daughter of Deacon Samuel Farrar of Lincoln, to family, 1804-1849.

**2003.011 Joshua Child Collection:** Joshua Child, descendent of Ephraim Child who came to Watertown in 1630, was a Lincoln constable, selectman, and held other municipal duties. By trade he was a farmer, weaver, and trader. Collection reflects family financial affairs and official business as constable.

**2003.012 First Parish Collection:** Records of the First Parish in Lincoln from its establishment in the Second Precinct of Concord, Lexington, and Weston in 1747, including records of church officials and church organizations; with papers of several of the ministers.

**2003.013 Unitarian Society Collection:** The Unitarian Congregational Society of Lincoln separated from the Orthodox church in Lincoln in 1841, and established a second parish, with church building at the center of Lincoln. Discussions related to a rejoining of the Unitarian and Congregational churches began in the 1920s, and the two churches formally merged in 1942 as First Parish in Lincoln.

**2003.014 St. Anne's Parish Collection:** St. Anne's Episcopal Church was established in Lincoln in 1874, the third religious organization in the town. The original church building has been added to and expanded over the years to meet current space needs. The Parish celebrated its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 1974.

**2003.015 Town of Lincoln, Administrative Records:** Administrative records of the Town of Lincoln include Town Meeting minutes and other records of 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries, Board of Selectmen's minutes, and related records of general government administration of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Includes records of establishment and operation of Second Precinct of Concord, Lexington, and Weston, 1746-1754.

**2003.016 Town of Lincoln, Town Clerk Records:** Town Clerk's records of the Town of Lincoln include vital records of the Town of the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries, mortgages and related records, and miscellaneous records.

**2003.017 Town of Lincoln, Military Records:** Military records include 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century militia lists, a record of Lincoln soldiers in the Civil War, documents relating to World War I tax abatements for veterans and related records, discharge papers of World War II veterans in Lincoln.

**2003.018 Town of Lincoln, Public Assistance Records:** Records relating to public assistance for the needy from 1905 to 1940 are in ledgers, correspondence, application forms, and other documents, and provide insight into the local level of support for the poor, as well as the number of needy in Lincoln through the early 20<sup>th</sup> century.

**2003.019 Town of Lincoln, Water Department Records:** Records relating to public water supply in Lincoln include ledgers of use and billing, expenses, and other financial records from 1887 to 1954, and minutes of the Water Commissioners from the 1980s and 1990s; and provide insight into municipal water use and resources.

**2003.020 Town of Lincoln, Collectors Records:** Records relating to the office of Collector of Taxes. Includes ledgers with payments from 1834 to 1956, as well as taxes of real property, personal property, and excise taxes.

**2003.021 Town of Lincoln, Assessors Records:** Records relating to the Board of Assessors, 1760-1990s, including minutes, valuation of real and personal property, tax abatements, assessment of valuation for excise tax, and related documents.

**2003.022 Town of Lincoln, Treasurer Records:** Records relating to the Offices of Treasurer and Accountant, include bills, receipts, purchase orders and related records; promissory notes issued for the Water Department, and other financial records.

**2003.023 Town of Lincoln, Board of Health Records:** Records relating to the Board of Health include meeting minutes, regulations, information relating to communicable diseases and rabies, and other health-related documents.

**2003.024 Town of Lincoln, Public Works Records:** Records relating to public works in Lincoln include documents of several parts of the town government relating to various aspects of public works, including public utilities, many of which are, in 2003, under the Department of Public Works.

**2003.025 Town of Lincoln, Planning Board Records:** Records relating to the Lincoln Planning Board include primarily minutes of meetings of the Planning Board and of the Long-Range Planning Committee, as well as minutes of the Board of Appeals for requests for zoning variances and non-conforming uses.

**2003.026 Town of Lincoln, School Records:** Records relating to the public schools in Lincoln from the 1820s to the present, reports, general educational materials, regional school records, provide insight into two centuries of public education in Lincoln. Also included are records relating to private schools in Lincoln.

**2003.027 Town of Lincoln, Environmental Records:** The collection comprises minutes of the Conservation Commission, Hanscom Field Advisory Commission, and other municipal committees relating to environmental aspects of Lincoln; documentation relating to local, state, and national parks within Lincoln; recreation, bicycle paths, etc.; materials relating to open space preservation and land use in Lincoln; water resources and waste management in Lincoln; materials relating to land use and environmental, including noise control, at Hanscom Field; and other miscellaneous records relating to Lincoln's environment.

**2003.028 Town of Lincoln, Financial Records:** Records relating to the Lincoln Finance Committee, primarily minutes of meetings and recommendations, with other miscellaneous financial records from various municipal agencies.

**2003.029 Town of Lincoln, Public Safety Records:** Records relating to the Lincoln Police and Fire Departments, minutes of committees relating to public safety, traffic control, etc., and miscellaneous documents and financial records relating to aspects of public safety.

**2003.030 Town of Lincoln, Council on Aging Records:** Records relating to the Lincoln Council on Aging and other programs and services for the elderly of Lincoln, including photograph collection activities.

**2003.031 Town of Lincoln, Miscellaneous Records:** Records relating to the activities of several municipal ad hoc committees, and other municipal or quasi-municipal committees of limited or specific purposes.

**2003.032 Town of Lincoln, Litigation Records:** Records and photographs relating to legal action by or against the Town of Lincoln relating to zoning, land use, and land-taking issues.

**2003.033 Town of Lincoln, Historical Commission Records:** Records of the Lincoln Historical Commission include inventory forms, National Register materials, documents relating to local Historic District By-Law, early industrial sites and other sites of early historical importance, and minutes.

**2003.034 Lincoln Public Library Records:** Records of the Lincoln Public Library includes Trustees' minutes, Treasurer's accounts and reports, early accession records, photographs, records relating to building and additions and related subjects, and other library-related documents.

**2003.035 Bemis Free Lecture Series and Lincoln Lyceum Records:** Records of the activities of the Bemis Free Lecture Series, established in 1892 through funds from a bequest of George F. Bemis, and ongoing through 2003. Collection also includes records of Lincoln Lyceum, 1830-1856.

**2003.036 Lincoln Aid Society of the Waltham Hospital Records:** Lincoln Aid Society of the Waltham Hospital organized in 1895 to provide support for Waltham Hospital, primarily sewing projects; in 1953 the focus was on Emerson Hospital in Concord. The Society dissolved after 1961.

**2003.037 Lincoln Cemeteries Collection:** Lincoln Cemetery Collection includes lists of burials in Precinct and Meetinghouse Cemeteries, copies of inscriptions from earliest stones, and a list of graves in Arbor Vitae Cemetery prepared in the 1940s by the DAR.

**2003.038 Lincoln Mohawks Collection:** Baseball in Lincoln started in 1873 with the establishment of the Forest Lake team, later the Lincolns, and then the Lincoln Mohawks in 1929. Interest waned in the 1950s, and the focus was directed toward youth baseball.

**2003.039 Lincoln Garden Club Collection:** Lincoln Garden Club was established in 1928 to promote gardens and gardening in Lincoln, to promote town beautification projects, and similar activities.

**2003.040 League of Women Voters of Lincoln Collection:** League of Women Voters of Lincoln was established in 1922 to encourage citizen participation in the political processes, and to educate voters on public issues.

**2003.041 Powers-Floyd Tinware Manuscript:** Manuscript of Early American decorated tinware, by Beatrice Farnsworth Powers and Olive Floyd, (Hastings House, 1957) with bibliographical notes.

**2003.042 Olive Floyd Flower Collection:** Scrapbooks of dried flowers collected 1912-1914 and manuscript relating to old standard (non-hybrid) flowers by Olive Floyd.

**2003.043 Hoover House Photograph Collection:** Photographs and negatives of houses designed by Henry Hoover, modern architect and Lincoln resident, in Lincoln, Massachusetts.

**2003.044 Miscellaneous Lincoln Organization Records:** Records, programs, and other documentation relating to various Lincoln organizations, including Grange, Temperance Societies, etc., from mid-1800s to 1990s.

**2003.045 Wesson and Smith Family Papers:** Family papers of the Wesson (Weston) and Smith Families, early Lincoln land owners, include accounts, deeds, letters, and other documents from 1725 to 1890.

**2003.046 Volkert Geography Paper:** Paper written ca. 1954 by L. John Volkert on natural and social history of Lincoln as a college geography assignment.

**2003.047 Smith Family Manuscript:** Manuscript of the Smith Family of Lincoln, compiled from tapes made by Sumner Smith in 1971.

**2003.048 Hartwell Farmstead Manuscript:** Manuscript of the Hartwell Farmstead, written by Gulli Kula, Harvard University, as a paper for a class in anthropology, in 1985.

**2003.049 Youth Activities Records:** History of youth activities in Lincoln from 1940 to 1995 compiled by the League of Women Voters.

**2003.050 Manuscript Records Collection:** 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century manuscript documents comprising deeds, warrants, financial records, and other records collected and sold to Lincoln Historical Society.

**2003.051 Lincoln Fire Department Collection:** History of the Lincoln Fire Department from ca. 1870s to 1990s, largely compiled from town reports.

**2003.052 Mount Misery Manuscript:** Historical land use and land owners of Mt. Misery in Lincoln, written for the Lincoln Land Conservation Trust in 1981.

**2003.053 Pierce Park Report:** A report to accompany the general plan for the John H. Pierce Park in Lincoln Center, drafted in 1931.

**2003.054 Lincoln Conservation Lands Papers:** Papers and oral history transcripts relating to conservation lands in the Town of Lincoln, prepared in 1981.

**2003.055 Lincoln Founding Families Collection:** Historical and genealogical notes relating to the founding families of Lincoln, assembled by Edith Biggs Farrar, former Lincoln librarian, and others.

**2003.056 Lincoln Snapshot Collection:** Snapshots taken of various events and scenes in Lincoln from ca. 1950s through 1990s, largely color prints.

**2003.057 Lincoln Family Records Collection:** Biographical and genealogical records, property and estate records, and notes relating to 18<sup>th</sup> century Lincoln, with related records.

**2003.058 Personal Reminiscences Collection:** Personal reminiscences of long-time Lincoln residents in several formats, mostly of early 20<sup>th</sup> century.

**2003.059 Lincoln 4<sup>th</sup> of July Photograph Collection:** Photographs of parades and events at Fourth of July celebrations in Lincoln from 1910 to 1982.

**2003.060 Lincoln 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Collection:** Photographs of parades and events relating to the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the incorporation of Lincoln, April 1954.



**2003.061 Lincoln Events/Observations Collections:** Photographs, documents, records of various events and observances in Lincoln including veterans recognition, Hartwell Farm fire, 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration, and other events.

**2003.062 Lincoln Personages Collection:** Mostly photographs of various Lincoln people and groups, including family members of many of the older Lincoln families, school groups, and other organizational group photographs.

**2003.063 Miscellaneous Lincoln Family Papers:** Mostly small collections of personal papers of many Lincoln families and people.

**2003.064 Lincoln, Mass./U.S.A. Bicentennial Collection:** Documents relating to the Lincoln 1975 Bicentennial Commission with publicity of the events in Lincoln and adjacent towns, and other bicentennial-related records.

**2003.065 Tarbell Family Collection:** Photographs of Tarbell family members, ca. 1880-1960, with letters and other documents relating to the Tarbells.

**2003.066 Stone Family Collection:** Personal and family papers of the Stone and related Fiske families, 17<sup>th</sup> century settlers in Middlesex County, an area which is now Lincoln, from late 1600s to mid-1800s.

**2003.067 Eleazer Brooks Scrapbook:** Personal and family papers of Eleazer Brooks, ca. 1740s-1790s, assembled in scrapbook format for the Lincoln Library in 1887.

**2004.001 Lincoln Scrapbook Collection:** Collection of scrapbooks of clippings, photographs, writings, etc., relating to Lincoln affairs and people, from various sources and time periods.

**2004.002 Farrar Historical Houses Manuscript:** Compilation of ownership history of houses in Lincoln over 100 years old, with photographs, by Edward R. Farrar and Samuel Farrar, written in 1935.

**2004.003 Old Brooks Road Manuscript:** History of Old Brooks Road in Lincoln, one of the first roads in present day Lincoln, laid out in 1729/1730.

**2004.004 Preston Papers:** The Preston Papers are a collection of primary and secondary source materials relating to miscellaneous Lincoln people, organizations, and events, dating from the 1940s to the 1980s, and collected by Jean Preston of Lincoln.

**2004.005 Miscellaneous Journals:** The Miscellaneous Journals are an artificial collection of 19<sup>th</sup> century diaries and account journals kept by three Lincoln residents.

**2004.006 Wheeler Family Papers:** The Wheeler family is one of the oldest families in Lincoln, having settled in the area in the 1600s. Family members have been active in local affairs since the incorporation of Lincoln in 1754. The collection comprises papers of several family members, mostly 19<sup>th</sup> century, and includes financial records, correspondence, and other documents.

**2004.007 Miscellaneous Photographs Collection:** Miscellaneous photographs of Lincoln people and groups, Lincoln events, street scenes, buildings, Lincoln views, and other subjects, of unknown and mixed provenance.

**2004.008 World War II Civil Defense Collection:** Documents relating to Town of Lincoln Committee on Public Safety, civil defense, rationing, blackouts, air raids, and other local aspects of World War II.

**2004.009 Burnham/Olmsted Drawings Collection:** Plans of the grounds of the W.A. Burnham estate on Fairhaven Bay in Lincoln, drafted by Fredrick Law Olmsted, with photographs of the house and grounds, and miscellaneous materials relating to the Olmsted Archives.

**2004.010 Baker Family Genealogical Collection:** Genealogy of the John and Elizabeth Baker family of Killingly, Connecticut, and allied families, from ca. 1690 to ca. 1980; emphasizing the Baker family branches that settled in the Lincoln-Concord area.

**2004.011 Smith/Sandy Pond Collection:** Photographs from Sumner Smith relating to dwellings on Lincoln Hill, Pierce Park area, and Sandy Pond; taken ca. 1880s-1900s.

**2004.012 Civil War Collection:** Correspondence, photographs, ephemera, and other materials relating to the Civil War, collected by G.G. Tarbell.

**2004.013 Land Court Records:** Land court records of Lincoln properties from 19<sup>th</sup> century, provide information on grantor-grantee, bounds, and other information.

**2004.014 Lincoln Authors Collection:** Articles and biographical information about Lincoln authors of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

**2004.015 Images of Lincoln Collection:** Copies of photographs and other materials used by the Lincoln Historical Society for *Images of Lincoln*.

**2004.016 Clement Cleveland Sawtell Diaries:** Excerpts from diaries of Clement Cleveland Sawtell, poet and dramatist, and Lincoln resident. Includes short plays by Sawtell.

**2004.017 Boy Scout Excursion Records:** Lincoln Boy Scouts traveled to Pyrenees in Spain and France in 1983; canoed Allegash River with Spanish Boy Scouts in 1984. Itineraries and reports included.

**2004.018 Lincoln Historical Society Records:** Minutes and miscellaneous papers from the Lincoln Historical Society, from 1961, the date of organization.

**2005.002 Town Buildings Program Transcriptions:** Transcriptions of tape recordings of a program on six of the historical public buildings at Lincoln Center. Presented May 9, 1979.

**2005.003 Lincoln Minute Men Collection:** Lincoln Minute Men is an organization which commemorates the 18<sup>th</sup> century Lincoln Minute Men that fought in the American Revolution.

They were also instrumental in the design and installation of historical markers on the route taken by the Minute Men from Lincoln to Concord on April 19, 1775,

**2005.004 Henry Higginson House National Register Documents:** The Henry Higginson house, on Baker Farm Road in Lincoln, was nominated to the National Register of Historic Places in 2005.

**2005.005 Helen L. Hall Collection:** Helen L. Hall was born Helen (Nell) Little, ca. 1912, and grew up in Lincoln. The collection comprises articles from her childhood in Lincoln.

**2005.006 Bemis/Wheeler Collection:** Genealogical information on the Bemis and Wheeler families of Lincoln, who intermarried in the 19<sup>th</sup> century.

**2005.007 Hatheway Family Photograph Collection:** Copy prints of photographs from Hatheway Family scrapbook, taken ca. 1910-1920, include 1920 July 4 parade, dwellings and other structures, groups of people, other photographs of the period.

**2006.001 Second Precinct Historical Documents Collection:** Photocopies of early records relating to the establishment of the Second Precinct of Concord, Lexington, and Weston, including some records of the construction of the meeting house, some papers of Rev. William Lawrence the first minister, and several records of the Flint family.

**2006.002 Jane Langton Papers:** Correspondence, artwork, and other materials written, collected, and donated by Jane Langton. Give insight to not only Langton's relationships with her correspondents, but also the development of work created by them.

**2006.003 Vanderhoof Hardware Store Booklet:** Booklet about the Vanderhoof Hardware Store in Concord written by local author Jane Langton.

**2006.005 Agricultural Maps Collection:** Maps relating to agriculture in Lincoln include a copy of Thoreau's map of the Hoar Farm and a map of 20<sup>th</sup> century farms.

**2006.012 Cold War Civil Defense Collection:** Identification cards, letters, and miscellany relating to civil defense in Lincoln during the Cold War of the early 1950s.

**2006.013 St. Joseph's Parish Collection:** St. Joseph's Roman Catholic Church was established as a mission church in 1904, became an independent Parish in 1945, and reverted to mission status in 2004 as the Diocese of Boston closed and merged various parishes.

**2007.001 Battle Road Critique:** Source materials for some of the Lincoln people involved in the Battle of Concord, and the events of April 19, 1775; and a critique of the pamphlet Heroes of Battle Road, by Frank Wilson Hersey.

**2007.003 Reminiscences of Mary Macomber Leue Collection:** Reminiscences of Mary Macomber Leue who lived on Bedford Road in Lincoln as a child, between 1925 and 1931.

**2007.004 Miriam Sweet Coombs Collection:** Materials and ephemera from her career, saved by Miriam Sweet Coombs, 1908-2007, who taught English at Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School from 1957 to 1972.

**2007.005 Lincoln 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Collection (*in processing*):** Photos from Lincoln's 250<sup>th</sup> Celebration.

**2007.006 Ruth Barbarow Collection:** Ruth Barbarow, 1918-2006, was a Lincoln artist, and left her works to the Friends of the Lincoln Council on Aging, with the provision that the works be sold and the proceeds be given to the Friends.

**2008.004 Lincoln Library Trustees' Records:** Records of the Lincoln Library Trustees include minutes from 1970 and miscellaneous related records; earlier minutes and related records found in 2003.034.

**2008.006 Baker Bridge Train Accident Collection:** Printouts and photocopies of clippings related to the 1905 railroad accident at Baker Bridge, which killed and injured many passengers.

**2008.007 Lincoln Library Planning Collection:** Surveys, plans, needs, reports relating to the Public Library in Lincoln, the Hartwell School library, and the Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School library.

**2008.008 Elizabeth Little Papers:** Historical and archaeological research materials relating to sites in Lincoln, collected or written by Elizabeth Little, Lincoln archaeologist and historian.
